- In the "Research" session, attendees will learn how to create a prospect profile, find potential donors, and rate prospects.
- "Romance" (cultivation of your fundraising prospects) is a 365-day-a-year opportunity for every staff
  and board member to raise vital funds and recruit allies and volunteers for their ACDN member
  organization. Learn how to think strategically and carefully plan multiple cultivation efforts for each
  unique donor prospect. Then focus your limited time and resources on the highest priority
  prospects.
- "Request" participants will focus on three tactics for any fundraising ask: 1) Change the perspective –
  Start with the Why; 2) Change the Story Continue with Who, and 3) Change the Result End with
  how.
- "Recognition" or stewardship is more than a thank you letter! Getting the first gift is important but what a charity does to retain that donor and how it works toward building a long-term relationship speaks to the process and methodology of stewardship will be discussed during this round of speed-dating.
