#### **GETTING TO PALM SPRINGS, CA: Overview of Travel Options**

- Palm Springs International Airport (PSP)
  - It is a small, beautiful airport with a couple of coffee shops and outdoor open space. It is in the heart of the city. When you land, you have arrived. This is the easiest destination when arriving by air, possibly more expensive, but worth it even if you have to make one stop to arrive here.
    - Airlines currently serving Palm Springs International Airport: Air Alaska, Alaska, Allegiant, American, Delta/Delta Connection, Jet Blue, Sun Country, United/United Express, Virgin America, and Westjet.
- Ontario International Airport (ONT)

This is a medium size airport that is 72 miles from Palm Springs. It is a straight shot on one freeway and you would arrive in an hour. (You do go right past the Desert Hills Premium Outlet Mall with 180 stores and you ride in through the windmills.)

• San Diego International Airport (SAN)
This is also a medium size airport that is right in the heart of downtown San





Diego. If you have any interest spending time there before or after the conference, it is totally worth it! It is 128 miles from Palm Springs and is a two-hour drive.

#### Los Angeles International Airport (LAX)

This is our largest and busiest airport in the state of California. It is 126 miles from Palm Springs. The drive consists of several freeways and lots and lots of traffic. It can take up to four hours. You may be able to fly into Los Angeles and then take a little plane that hops over to Palm Springs Airport in 30 minutes. It is expensive. Plus, remember our "season" starts on October 1<sup>st</sup>.

• Phoenix International Airport (PHX)

It is possible to fly to Phoenix, Arizona and drive over to Palm Springs. The drive takes about 4 hours.
